14 Day Adventure in Namibia

Namibia, land of colours, open spaces, unique landscapes, exciting wildlife and historical and cultural diversity.

Wherever your destination in this country may be, no day will be like the other. There is so much to see and do that excitement will be a constant companion. Hiking, canoeing, biking or hot air ballooning give you the opportunity to view the country's beauty from various perspectives. This itinerary shall provide you an idea of how to explore Namibia's multi-faceted character in different ways.



Day 1: Namaqualand

Starting from Cape Town the first stop will be **Namaqualand**. This region in the North-West corner of South Africa is famous for an extraordinary springtime transformation of the lifeless scrubland into a true explosion of colours resulting in a multitude of small flowers. Furthermore it is home to antelopes such as springbok and bontebok and you may also see tortoises and chameleons - the masters of camouflage. As an extension of this tour we offer a 4 or 6 day rafting / canoeing trip on the **Orange River**.

Day 2: Fish River Canyon

We cross the Orange River, which is also the border into Namibia. From here we visit the **Fish River canyon**, second largest canyon in the world and one of the most impressive natural beauties in the southern part of Namibia. Explore its beauty while hiking through the Canyon Nature Park or adjacent Godwana Canyon Park.

Day 3 & 4: Sesriem and Sossusvlei

Continue through the **Namib Naukluft Park** to **Sossusvlei**. Here the enormous 300 m high sand dunes are one of the most phenomenal sights in the world. Any footprints left in the sand will appear like ant trails from above. Enjoy the suave curves of this region while hot air ballooning through blue skies!

Day 5 & 6: Swakopmund

We leave the desert and reach the coast near Walvis Bay. Continue to **Swakopmund**, the premier holiday resort in Namibia where you find a fusion of modern spirits and old German traditions. Scale the sand dunes on a quad bike or watch flamingoes, pelicans, dolphins and many more while kayaking the Walvis Bay lagoon near Swakopmund!

Day 7: Southern Damaraland – Twyfelfontein

From Swakopmund the journey takes us north into the Twyfelfontein area. We overnight and take this opportunity to view some of the richest collections of stone-age **rock engravings** in Africa. Other attractions nearby are the island mountain Spitzkoppe, the Brandberg and the Petrified Forest, a sandstone plateau where over 250 million old trees are conserved for eternity.

Day 8 - 10: Etosha Pan National Park

At over 22 000 km² Etosha Pan is one of the most important game reserves in the world. This is where we spend the following 2 nights. You can opt between the rustic, simple accommodation inside the park or the more luxurious versions situated outside the park. On **safari** you may spot many different animals like lion, cheetah, black rhino, elephant and antelopes.



Day 11: Waterberg

Departing Etosha we head southwards to North-Central Namibia, to the Waterberg Plateau Area, a fascinating region of extraordinary geological formations that holds visible reminders of dinosaur existence. Explore the area on a hike and find wild fig trees, fire lilies and coral trees. Watch out for the Black and White Rhino, Sable Antelope and Blue Wildebeest.

Day 12 & 13: Windhoek

Our journey ends in Windhoek, **Namibia's capital**. It is a multi-cultural city with its German history still reflected in architecture and street names. As an alternative to the usual city tour, discover the safari adventure on a mountain bike in a nearby Game Park. In this oasis of calm you will be able to watch kudus, zebras, giraffes or wildebeests and over 200 different bird species at a close distance!

Day 14: Homebound

The tour ends with a transfer to the Windhoek Hosea Kutako International Airport for your flight home, or we can arrange an extension and travel via the **Kalahari Game Reserve** and the Northern Cape to Johannesburg where your tour will end on arrival at the airport.
